Policies & Code of Conduct

As an appointed coach of the Burlington Girls Hockey Club I pledge to follow the Coaches' Code of Conduct

- I am responsible for my conduct at all times. I will always be a positive representative of BGHC and the City of Burlington.
- I will maintain an open line of communication with players and parents. I will explain my goals and objectives for the team, as well as the rules of the game and the policies of the league, to the best of my ability.
- I will be reasonable when scheduling games and practices, remembering that players have other interests and obligations.
- I will teach my players to play fairly and to respect the rules, officials and opponents.
- I will ensure that all players get equal instruction, support and playing time.
- I will not ridicule or yell at my players for making mistakes or for performing poorly. I will remember that players play to have fun and must be encouraged to have confidence in themselves.
- I will ensure that equipment and facilities are safe and match the players' ages and abilities.
- I will remember that participants need a coach they can respect. I will be generous with praise and set a good example.
- I will obtain proper training and continue to upgrade my coaching skills.
- I will work in cooperation with officials to the benefit of the game.

Process and reminders for the Team Roster / Waiver

Process:

- ✓ Use template found on BGHC website
- √ Submit waiver to Gail Marcos office@bghc.ca
- ✓ All parents and players must sign this document
- ✓ All staff must be listed, including their certification numbers
- ✓ Roster approval required prior to tournaments / exhibition games
- ✓ Deadline for submission October 27th

Goalie Sharing:

- Novice 1 signed up as 50%, plenty signed up as sometimes
- Atom 3 signed up as FT, 11 have signed up as sometimes, shared situation for others
- Peewee 3 FT, 2 as sometimes
- Bantam 3 FT, shared situation for others
- Midget 5 signed up as FT, Rep players will help fill last spot

- ✓ Respect in Sport (RIS)
- ✓ Police Check (valid within 3 yrs)

Assistant Coaches (1 +)

Certification - RIS and Valid Police Check

Role:

- ✓ Positive reinforcement to players
- ✓ Support in practices and games

Manager

Certification - Valid Police Check

Role:

- √ Complete Roster/waiver
- ✓ Book Tournaments and hotels
- ✓ Game Sheets collection / submission
- ✓ Ensure Refs arrival at games
- ✓ Supports team communications

Trainers (min 1)

Certification - RIS, valid Policy Check & HTCP

Role:

- ✓ On bench for health/safety
- ✓ Enforce concussion protocol

Bryce O'Hagan will offer "drop in" session every month for all HL goalies and funds will be allocated to goalie families for private lessons with Bryce







IP & Novice Half Ice

We will Follow the Hockey Canada Guidelines:

- ✓ Small drill stations and small area games
- √ Focus on skill development not game play
- ✓ Cross ice games (IP1)
- √ Half ice games (IP2)
- ✓ No Goalies
- ✓ Mini Nets
- ✓ FOCUS ON FUN
- ✓ IP Tournaments: you can rotate goalies







Understanding the expectations of game play and guidelines for tournaments

Games & Tournaments

Game Play Guidelines

- ✓ Ensure fair ice time
 - ✓ Conveners & coaches report any concerns to the Director Zak
- ✓ Keep scoring reasonable Don't run it up!
- ✓ IP & Novice rotate Goalies (no dedicated)
- ✓ Home Team responsible for:
 - ✓ Game sheet submission to gamesheet@bghc.ca

Tournaments

- √ 2 maximum, one of which can be "away"
 - No tournaments during February Playoffs unless special approval
 - A 3rd tournament can be entered after the season is complete
- ✓ Email Zak at juniorhouseleague@bghc.ca tournament details:
 - Division (e.g. Atom HL)
 - Team (e.g. Blue)
 - Date of tournament and impacted HL scheduled games

 Note: Scheduler will try to reschedule league game and notify other team
- ✓ Pick up players you need a signed release form by other coach

15	9 (3 lines) - rotate	6 (3 pairings) - rotate
14	9 (3 lines) - rotate	5 (rotate in sequence)
13	9 (3 lines) - rotate	4 (2 pairings) - rotate
12	8 (rotate in sequence)	4 (2 pairings) - rotate
11	7 or 6 - rotate	4 or 5 - rotate
10	6 (2 lines) - rotate	4 (2 pairings) - rotate

House League Back to Hockey Weekend September 7th & 8th 2019

Saturday, Sept 7 - Mainway B

7:30 to 9:00 a.m. Atom Division - group A 9:00 to 10:30 a.m. Atom Division - group B 10:30 to 11:30 p.m. Novice Division - group B 12:30 - 1:30 p.m. IP Open Skate

What is it?

- Upon arrival, players will be randomly divided into 3 teams
- · Teams will play a round robin fun tournament
- Game time approx. 30 minutes long (90 second buzzer system)
- Using 3 on 3 rules but play as 4 on 4 or 5 on 5 (depending on total numbers)

Volunteers Needed

- 4 or 6 people on benches to help organize players and run doors (2 benches x 2/3 people)
- Evaluators to assess the players for team allocation
- 1 trainer for each Ice Grouping (90 min commitment)
